

Tampa Port Authority Sovereign Lands Management Initiatives Program Submittal Guidelines

The Tampa Port Authority (TPA) is encouraging grant applications for its Sovereign Lands Management Initiatives Program. The program has funding of \$50,000 available for projects that provide environmental benefit for Tampa Port Authority Sovereignty areas. Eligible projects will be considered that provide for the preservation, restoration, and enhancement of ecological resources in Sovereignty areas of Hillsborough County that include Tampa Bay, the Alafia River, the Hillsborough River, the Little Manatee River, and Lakes Keystone and Thonotosassa.

Project concepts may originate from or be proposed by community groups, corporations, non-profit organizations, or government agencies. Proposals must be considered permittable or eligible for authorization(s) by appropriate regulatory agencies. Community grants of up to \$10,000 will be given special consideration. Matching funds are encouraged but are not necessary. Project areas must be located on public land and must positively benefit sovereignty areas under the jurisdiction of the Tampa Port Authority. Requests for funding to provide permanent employment positions or implementation of agency mandated mitigation or restoration requirements will not be considered.

Proposals must be received at the Tampa Port Authority, 1101 Channelside Drive, Tampa, FL 33602, Attn: Environmental Department, up to and until 2:00 p.m. on Friday, August 31, 2007 and must include one (1) original and ten (10) copies of the Information Application & Questionnaire and requested submittal documents. The Information Application & Questionnaire is available for download at the TPA's website www.tampaport.com or by calling 813-905-5031.

Projects selected for funding will be those recommended by the TPA Sovereign Lands Advisory Committee, which consists of public agencies and citizen representatives. Favorable consideration will be given to projects, which involve:

<u>Restoration of the Environment</u> – Returning natural functions to an adversely impacted system, i.e., restoring natural grades, restoring hydroperiods or tidal circulation, exotic vegetation control, re-establishment of native plant communities, removal of debris or pollutants, water quality improvement, or creation of wildlife habitat.

Enhancement of the Environment – This is similar to restoration, but with emphasis on improvement of established natural systems.

<u>Protection of the Environment and Native Species</u> – Management, monitoring, research, education, and preservation necessary to ensure ongoing success of restoration or enhancement projects and protection of native species of flora and fauna. Examples may include public education through informational signage, brochures and navigational aids and the installation of boardwalks or trails, which restrict foot traffic

through sensitive areas. Water quality monitoring and research that results in an applied solution to the restoration of natural functions to an area and projects that support or enhance the adopted Action Plans of the Tampa Bay Estuary Program Comprehensive Conservation and Management Plan will be given consideration.
